


Merry Hill Walk

Self guided walks


Magnificent panoramic views as far as Windsor

3 parking spaces for disabled on site for RADAR key holders


By Public Transport:

Friends of Attenborough's Fields



Attenborough's Fields are owned by Hertfordshire County Council. The fields, ponds and hedgerows within the site are all managed to benefit wildlife.

Merry Hill is former farmland bought by the Woodland Trust in 1996. 60,000 trees have been planted here and in time they will grow into mature deciduous woodland, good for nature conservation, wildlife and future generations.




